Welcome back to the pub! Hoping to see oodles of folk on 1st June for the party.



Church Letter



I write this in the days following Easter and with all the promise of warmer weather to come. The late spring is a wonderful time to enjoy the many signs of new life. It has always been a happy linkage between spring and Easter; there are so many parallels to be drawn with the resurrection and the new life of the Christian in Jesus Christ. In the church there is still the anticipation of Pentecost or Whit Sunday as it was known for centuries in this country. Whit Sunday was 'White Sunday', a time for celebrating the perfection of Christ, the presence of Christ in individual Christians and the empowerment of the church through the coming of the Holy Spirit of God.

This became a celebration for local communities - many fairs and street processions have their origins in the Whit weekend. But that was never the whole story. The pages of the 'Acts of the Apostles' in the New Testament are full of accounts of the power of God working in his church and the resultant rapid growth of Christianity throughout the known world. Amid the many stories of decline in our churches today, are accounts of growth and vitality both here and around the world. I am reminded of G K Chesterton's famous comment that there have been times in the history of the church when it has been going to the dogs. 'On each occasion it has been the dog that died'.

In June we have our church and school fete. This draws together the shared life of the village, the school and the church. It is that which we celebrate and which helps to demonstrate the continuing life of the Christian community in Baydon, as there is 'There is still life in the old dog'.

Baydon Boys Golf Society



Reporting Internet Fraud to the Police

Most of us have been subjected to at least one of the many types of (attempted) fraud, perhaps on the Internet. If you want to report what happened to you, whether or not you responded to the email (or however the approach was made) and whether or not money was lost, the Police now operate a country-wide and purpose-built agency to deal with it called Action Fraud. It can only be accessed via tel: 0300-123-2040 or its website: http://www.actionfraud.police.uk/report_fraud. The attempted fraud's definition may be a little complicated but I felt it was well worth the effort to make my report.

101

101 is the number to call when you want to contact the police - when it's less urgent than 999.

In a **NON EMERGENCY** dial 101 if:





Film Review – “Mud”

Written and directed by Jeff Nichols; starring Matthew McConaughey, Tye Sheridan, Sam Shepard, and Reese Witherspoon.



Hi, name is Mud – literally. Figuratively, too; this remains subtly implicit in the film. Trying to come to the aid of a girl he has loved since he was their age, Mud is in hiding from the villains she has got mixed up with, roughing it on a small island in the Mississippi where two teenage lads, Ellis and Neck-bone, discover him. Does she want to be rescued or is she stringing him along? How could he help her, anyway? Mud needs a boat, and the only one in evidence has been stuck in a tree for years (not as implausible as it sounds – watch the film to see why!) The river-dwelling lads hesitantly agree to help – putting themselves in line for danger, at a time already in upheaval for them – growing up, their peers, their family situations, and the threat to their river homes

and livelihoods from local authority development policies. Who, among all the people they know, however long or short a time they've known them, can be relied upon? Who will come through when the going gets tough? Questions of honesty, trust and loyalty are raised.

Finely tuned suspense and menace build through the film. In the end - maybe everyone has a bit of heroism in his heart, and can make a better future. It is well acted, and worth seeing – but it isn't one to watch for a relaxing, fun time. (UK certificate 12A).
