In the aftermath of the events and the tragic loss of PC Keith Palmer, a number of Community Policing Teams across the county witnessed an outpouring of support from local communities. The generosity and kindness shown by Wiltshire residents has not gone unnoticed and is greatly appreciated by all at Wiltshire Police - we are proud to serve you.

In March, Wiltshire Police was pleased to host another awards ceremony, which not only recognised the work of officers and staff but praised the bravery and quick thinking of members of the public.

Current Priorities Marlborough and surrounding areas.

Theft from motor vehicles

Whilst predominantly a seasonal issue more prevalent in the warmer and lighter months, this area has seen a number of vehicles broken into at both beauty spots and village and town locations. Intelligence work is ongoing in relation to those nominal who engage in this type of criminality. We are also working closely with our partners in relation to engagement and target hardening measures. Further work is being undertaken to improve signage and to highlight the possibility of offences being committed when parked in these locations, officers continue to patrol our beauty spots and offer security advice to those we meet.

Dwelling and non-dwelling burglaries

From a review of the numbers of burglaries in Marlborough and the surrounding area which totalled twenty nine since the commencement of CPT on 17th October 2016 to the 4th December 2016, we then created this as a priority to allow for targeted patrols, intelligence development and progress in these investigations. To date, we have carried out over 110 of these targeted patrols. In the month since the last report, we have had seven reported burglaries – four dwelling and three non-dwelling.

We have experienced a significant reduction in the numbers of burglaries in the Pewsey villages in recent months following our focus upon such a priority.

Wiltshire Police continue to limit the number of offences by pro-active policing and ongoing policing operations in these areas. A rural crime operation was carried out in early February. This involved local estate managers and gamekeepers, as well as our colleagues from Thames Valley Police, there are more planned in the coming weeks and months alongside or Special Constabulary colleagues.

Community intelligence is crucial for us to take action on this priority so please continue to report incidents, information and any concerns.

Of note two males from out of county were arrested following a dwelling burglary in Marlborough during the morning of Thursday 9th March 2017, located during an area search by officers.
