Clergy letter...

Sue Rodd writes.....

Because of the nature of magazine deadlines, I'm sitting writing this surrounded by the aftermath of Christmas – crumpled wrapping paper, and far too many little tubs of tatty leftovers in the fridge! Whereas by the time you're reading it, I suspect that the festivities of Christmas will be just a memory, and



even the New Year good resolutions will have come and gone. Which doesn't actually leave much of a gap before we start looking ahead to Lent, which starts later this month – and perhaps kicks off another set of good resolutions that we may find hard to keep? And that set me wondering why it is that although we may have all sorts of good intentions, we sometimes find them surprisingly hard to live up to?

As far as Lent is concerned, most people seem to think of it (if they think about it at all) in terms of "giving something up", and all that seems to happen is you immediately develop a craving for that particular thing. And then the six weeks of Lent seems like an eternity... But what Lent is really all about is clearing away clutter that gets between us and God, and between us and other people – a sort of spiritual "spring cleaning" that brings us to the full joy of Easter at the end of it.

So perhaps it's better to do something positive than just "give something up"? Jesus told a potent story about a man who conquered his demons but didn't replace them with anything constructive, ultimately ending up worse off than when he started.

The "Love Life, Live Lent" programme (<u>http://www.livelent.net/</u>) suggests all sorts of positive ways of approaching Lent that might provide a good starting point. It might be something as simple as putting a tin or two in the "Food Bank" basket in the church each week rather than eating more than we need, or it might take us into something more scary – mending a relationship that could do with some TLC, for instance, or taking part in a Lent Course?

Whatever you choose to do, I wish you a helpful and constructive Lent! With love

The Parish Churches of The Whitton Benefice ANNUAL MEETINGS 2012

The 'Annual General Meetings' of each Parish Church take place each year before the end of April. The dates of the meeting for the parish of Baydon is :

Baydon - Wednesday 14th March at 7.30pm

Each AGM is a two-stage process. The first meeting is the **Annual Meeting of Parishioners** (sometimes called the 'Vestry Meeting') for the election of churchwardens. Any resident of the Parish is entitled both to attend **and to vote**, whether or not their name is on the church's Electoral Roll.

The second meeting is the **Annual Parochial Church Meeting** at which the principal business is the election of representatives of the laity to the Marlborough Deanery Synod (every three years), the Parochial Church Council and the Whitton Team Council; to receive the churchwardens' report on the state of the church building and contents; and to receive the Treasurer's report. Again, any resident of the Parish is entitled to attend, but ONLY those whose names are on the church's Electoral Roll are entitled to vote in the election of Deanery Synod members, PCC members or Team Councillors, or on any propositions laid before the meeting.

It is important for your Parish Church to have the support of the community, and for YOU to have the opportunity to express your views about the way in which it works. Please come along to the Annual Meetings and play your part in the life of your local Church.

BEWARE!! 'BEAT A QUOTE ' ROGUE TRADING

Residents in BAYDON, MARLBOROUGH reported to police that on Monday 16th Jan 2012 at around 16:00hrs a company was touting for business and distributing leaflets.

The company is called <u>'Beat a Quote'</u> and leaflets show the company address as PRAMA HOUSE, 267 BANBURY ROAD, OXFORD OX27HT telephone numbers 01865 339544 or mob 07748872864

The people who run this company are from Swindon and have both recently been **convicted of Rogue Trading Fraud** offences and imprisoned following a case led by Oxfordshire Trading Standards. The company targeted elderly and vulnerable residents charging extortionate prices work with initial low quotes.

Precycle for Wiltshire

Plastic bottle and cardboard collections update

The main roll out of blue lidded bins for the collection of plastic bottles and cardboard has now been completed and collections have successfully started in north, east and west Wiltshire. On average over 700 tonnes of plastic bottles and cardboard are now collected from households in Wiltshire each month and diverted from landfill. This is a tremendous start.

With any large rollout of this size (over 135,000 bins) it is inevitable that some properties will have been missed by our contractors. Our own staff, with their greater local knowledge, are now working overtime and at weekends to deliver bins to the remaining properties that have been missed.

"One Day" by David Nicholls.

"One Day" is a gem. It follows Emma and Dexter as they move through life in the 20 years following graduation, best friends really, though not quite realising it, their paths crossing infrequently, but always keeping in touch.

The characters really do grow up and mature, experiencing various joys, facing various difficulties, sometimes wading through them, sometimes just suffering them, eventually overcoming them. Times of wondering what to do, times of focus; times of chance (or mischance) and times planned. The book updates us every 15th of July from 1988 to 2007.

You can see the development even of Emma and Dexter's language and attitudes as time progresses and events pass – travelling, getting jobs, changing them, losing them; meeting people, and the effects they have; attending friends' weddings and seeing their children grow. Things most of us experience. The characters ring true; these could be people you've known. The essential "them" remains at the core, but they grow up. Other, more incidental characters, quirky or otherwise, also unfold, popping in and out of the story, as friends and contacts are wont to do in life. I do recommend this book; the story drew me in, and I really wanted to know how things worked out for Emma and Dexter. Read it, and you'll find out what happened!

A SCHOOL HISTORY LESSON

In the 19th century free schools were set up in all communities. In 1843 the Earl of Craven provided 2 roods and 32 perches for use during the lifetime of a school in Baydon. The size of the land calculates exactly to 0.7 of an acre, this parcel of land was placed into the trust of the vicar, the churchwardens and the overseers of Baydon. "For the purposes...... as a Site for a School to be in Union with the Incorporated National Society for the promotion of Education...... in the principles of the Established Church of England......"



The school and church in the late 19th century

If at any time the property was not used for a school then it would revert to the ownership of the Craven family. The Right Honourable William 1st Earl of Craven left his estates in Wiltshire and Berkshire, the latter being the Ashdown Estate, to his eldest son William, his estates being entailed.

In 1965 Mr and Mrs Philip Mather lived at Barleymead, Aldbourne Road. 26 They both took much interest in the school and the children of the village. Philip Mather was a solicitor with the Swindon firm Lemon & Co., he was a churchwarden and a governor at the School for several years.

Being a churchwarden he would be a trustee of the school, and being a solicitor he would be aware of the School Sites Act 1841. He would know that the land could revert to the Craven family should there cease to be need of a school in Baydon.

To cover any such eventuality Mr and Mrs Mather sought the opinion of a Barrister at Lincolns Inn. From this advice, in 1968 Mr and Mrs Mather bought the freehold of the site from the Craven Estates and gave it into a trust – eventually know as The Sylvia Mather Charity. In 1991 the charity was registered with the Charity Commission.

One of the main named purposes of the Charity is to promote education and provide a school in Baydon. In the past, the Charity has assisted the School in paying for the mobile classroom 'Finches' and the CDT room. It has also made awards to Baydon young

people entering into higher education, to assist them with the initial expense of their studies.

Some of this history has been printed in this magazine in past issues. But it should be remembered that the site was established for a School and the site will always be there for the village.
