This month sees the culmination of months of planning in communities across the country; special services in church, lunches, flower displays, community events and much, much more. The Queen's Diamond Jubilee is an opportunity to give



thanks for the Queen's service to this country over many years and it is a chance to celebrate all that is good about our community life in difficult times.

The idea of Jubilee is an ancient one. In Biblical times the Jubilee was a time for celebrating God's goodness and a time for making things right in the world and society. The Hebrew Jubilee (50 years) was a year in which the land rested - there was no planting or harvesting. It was a year in which property was returned to the original owner, indentured labourers were freed from obligation and Hebrew slaves were bought out of slavery by the community.



BAYDON'S TRAFFIC CALMING WORKING GROUP The Big Update

1. Baydon Parish Council feel strongly that their top priority is to get <u>a physical traffic calming measure</u> installed in Ermin Street, near the playground at the eastern entrance of the village. Community Speedwatch results show that this is where the highest speeds are happening. Our intention is to slow all the traffic entering the village from the Lambourn direction therefore improving the situation throughout the village.



a. As a first step, Highways have suggested that they redesign the road markings between the white gates and the playground with the aim of making the road appear more narrow and making drivers use more caution when entering the village. Baydon Parish Council is pursuing this project and the necessary funding through CATG (Community Area Transport Group) and Marlborough Area Board.




b. Highways are also going to draw up some plans and costings for installing a traffic island in the middle of the road between the Eastern white gates. This is a much larger, more costly and longer term project as it will involve widening the road and landscaping etc. CATG (Community Area Transport Group) do not have enough funds, but could

assist us to apply to a central Wiltshire pot of money, if Baydon was prepared to contribute towards the project. Baydon Parish Council will consider this project when the plans and costings are available.

2. Baydon Parish Council has just formally agreed to participate in the "Reclaiming our Villages" project with the Parish Forum. This is a group of Wiltshire Villages getting together and using a specialist consultant to design traffic calming measures large and small – but all extremely clever, with the emphasis on being in keeping with the village surroundings and looking at the design speed of the our village roads rather than relying on the legal speed

BAYDON'S TRAFFIC CALMING WORKING GROUP Continued....

- 3. Baydon Parish Council has formally requested to be in the 2nd group of villages to go through the process and therefore, this will project for Baydon will start in approx. 2013 /14
- 4. Baydon Parish Council requested that Baydon's C146 Road / Ermin Street is one of only two roads in the Marlborough area that can have a speed limit review this year. This request was very recently supported by CATG which is a very positive. (MAB should formally approve this in their May meeting) This means that Highways are able to consider moving the 30MPH limits further out or putting a 40MPH Zones in. For example, Baydon Parish Council want Highways to consider extending the 30MPH limit to include the Cricket Field entrance.
- 5. Baydon's Taking Action on School Journeys is on a list of projects from a variety of Wiltshire schools, recommended to be given the budget to go ahead. Dick Tong (Cabinet Member) is due to make the final decision shortly. This project is mainly focused on improving the Aldbourne/ Ermin Street Junction, widening the pavement near the school and providing better crossing points for the children.
- 6. Baydon continues to be on the rota for the Speed Indicator Device that stays in the village for a fortnight at a time and flashes up the speed that the drivers are doing.
- 7. Community Speedwatch continues to operate approx once a week and have recorded and reported to the police, cars doing speeds up to 75MPH!

Thames Water - Drought

As you must know, we are under a Thames Water Temporary Use Ban (hosepipe ban). For information about exactly what that means and for tips and water saving freebies, go to: http://www.thameswater.co.uk/waterwisely/index.htm#!/ about.htm



Other water saving ideas gleaned from villagers: :air launder clothes, share a flush, (and a bath), use laundry balls to save rinse water in the washing machine and dishwasher - available online (i.e. Lakeland Plastics), don't leave tap water running when cleaning teeth, collect pre-shower water to flush the loo, install more water butts for watering the garden, use pre-washing up water for watering plants, and so on.

It looks unlikely that, even if there were more rain as we've had recently, Thames Water will lift the ban so get those water butts plumbed in!



TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE

Part of the A4 around Avebury will temporarily be closed overnight for a week or so for carriageway resurfacing etc. The alternative route is quite lengthy so worth avoiding.....

Temporary Closure of: A4 (Part) Beckhampton to West Overton, Avebury and West Overton (Ref: A2/RC 2012/39)

Notice is hereby given that the Wiltshire Council has made an Order to close temporarily to all traffic:

A4 (Part) Avebury and West Overton; from its junction with Beckhampton Roundabout (A4361/A361) in an easterly direction to its junction with UC 126801 Bell Lane, West Overton.



Alternative route: via A4361 (Beckhampton – Wroughton), B4005 (Wroughton – Chiseldon), A346 (Chiseldon to Marlborough), A4 (Marlborough to West Overton) and vice versa.

The closure will be clearly indicated by traffic signs.




