

The View from the Window, Part Three

Apologies, if this is starting to sound like Playschool! Today, let's look through the... train window.

I'm travelling from south-east France to Paris, to catch the Eurostar. Bright spring sunshine illuminates a verdant landscape, the leaves on the trees in full, plump greenness, acacias profusely dotted with creamy blooms, poplars shivering, yellow broom dazzling. Or it might be gorse – hard to tell at this speed, and my horticultural knowledge does not extend to knowing if either is in the right season.




The horizon gets further away, the further north we get, as the landscape smoothes out and flattens. It is as if a massive boulder was dropped somewhere in the south, emanating rocky ripples which start craggy and high, then calm down into rolling, earthy undulations before easing off almost completely in the north.

Corn and sunflowers are growing in the south. Further north, I see more wheat and arable crops; some fields smudged yellow as the oil-seed rape is going over; a bright daub of scarlet where partying poppies have gate-crashed a wheat field a more subtle tinge of red on yellow where the poppies have made a more timid entrance into a field of oil-seed rape.

The train passes mostly through countryside the whole length of the journey. The view is very pleasant all the way, for those happy out of town. It gets more built up, of course, as Paris approaches. And then the light, airy, steel and glass welcome of Gare de Lyon.

During his early working years based in London, he became involved in worship at the Bloomsbury Baptist Church, so although he finally moved to Baydon he continued to travel to London spending weekends at the church. He would arrive early on Saturday morning and leave late on Sunday night.


