From the Minister...

Minister's Letter, October 2014

Once again, we're celebrating harvest, reminding us of the very special rural communities that we live in. It acts as a reminder, too of how much better we flourish in community. The modern world – and rightly so – lays great emphasis on the value of the individual, and on our rights as individuals to find our own self-fulfilment. But it's one of the odd paradoxes of life that we actually become most truly ourselves when we form strong relationships that allow us to blossom – and to do that, we need to live in community with others: our families, our friends and our neighbours (in the widest sense).

Our capacity for building relationships and community are among the things that lead the Bible to describe human beings as being "made in the image of God". At their best, though, our relationships, however good they are, give us only a tiny glimpse of the love that God shows, which we ought to try to reflect in the way we live our lives.

And that's why we need to be aware that even in strong communities like ours, it's possible to be lonely, it's possible to be sad, that some people are ill or have suffered bereavement. And sometimes such troubles may be harder to bear if everyone else seems to be happy and having a good time.

So let's give thanks for family and friends, for community and village – but let's do it with eyes wide open to the needs of others, because it's only then that our communities will really feel like true communities for everyone in them, where everyone can flourish as they should.

BAYDON MEN WHO FELL IN THE 1914-18 WAR (IN ORDER OF DECEASE)

In this, the Centenary year of WW1 a group of villagers have researched the men of Baydon who fought and fell in this war.

We are pleased to list in the Scene the research done so far as a roll of honour for local men who lost their lives:

Pte Harry **ILOTT** - 6860, 1st Bn, Wiltshire Regiment who died on 18 October 1914. Age 29. NKG.

Remembered with Honour: Le Touret Memorial, Ligny Le Grand, Pas de Calais, France. Panels 33&34

Medals: British War Medal, Victory Medal, Mons Star

A farm lad. Born about 1885 in Faringdon, Berkshire. Son of Thomas ILOTT (1853-1941) and Mary Ann LEA (1856-1898), of Bailey Hill Farm, Baydon.

Married to Caroline Eliza Merrifield **YOUNG** (1894-) daughter of William **YOUNG** of Egbury, Hampshire. She lived at 48 Turnbull, Oxenwood, Hungerford after the War. Had a child, *living*?

Pte Alfred **MARCHANT** - 5050, 2nd Bn., Wiltshire Regiment who died on 22 October 1914. Age 34.

Remembered with Honour: Perth Cemetery (China Wall), Ieper, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium. Plot X. B. 28. Medals: British War Medal, Victory Medal, Mons Star

A boilermaker's helper, Locomotive and Carriage Department, GWR, Swindon. Member of the Salvation Army. Born Feb 1880 in Ramsbury, Wiltshire. Son of William MARCHANT (c 1853-1932) and Eliza (c 1861-) Husband of Ellen Rose KELLY (1884-1955) daughter of Charles KELLY (1860-). They married 22 June 1907 in Swindon and lived at 24 Dixon St., Swindon.

Pte Arthur James **DAVIS** - 10551, 5th Bn., Royal Berkshire Regiment who died on 17 February 1916. Age 31. NKG.

Ploughman. Born Oct 1884, Aldbourne, Wiltshire. Christened at St Nicholas, Baydon 5 Oct 1884.

Son of Jacob DAVIS of Aldbourne (1823-1897) and Mary Ann MARCHANT of Ramsbury (1843-).

Remembered with Honour: Calais Southern Cemetery, Pas de Calais, France. Plot C. 3. 13

Born Q3 1896, Highworth, Son of Frederick John Harris **LAWRENCE** (1871-) and Maria (1866-) both born in Baydon and of Bailey Cottages, The Square, Baydon Railway Sub-Office, Baydon, Wiltshire in 1921.

Pte Thomas **RADBOURNE**- 17839, "B" Coy. 1st Bn., Royal Berkshire Regiment who died on 24 May 1916. Age 37.

Remembered with Honour: Zouave Valley Cemetery, Souchez, Pas de Calais, France. Plot II. A. 19.

Born 1879 in Baydon. Son of William **RADBOURNE** (1847-) and Prudence Ann (1846-). Resident of Henley on Thames in 1911. Married, 1912, Louisa **ILOTT** (1878-1950) in Henley on Thames. Louisa was the sister of Harry **ILOTT** (1885-1914) above.

Pte Francis Edward **GIGG** - 25403, 1st Bn, Wiltshire Regiment who died on 24 August 1916. Age 30

Remembered with Honour: Puchevillers British Cemetery, Somme, France. Plot III. E. 21.

A carman on the road. Born at Wexcombe, Grafton, Wiltshire in 1886 to Charles **GIGG** (1859-) and Martha Ann **STOUT** (1859-) who moved to Baydon. He married Florence M. **BROOMFIELD** (1890-1954) in Salisbury in the first quarter of 1916. She lived at Pundle View, Bartley, near Southampton after the War.

Frank's sister, Beatrice (1894-1982), married William **GOSLING** (1896-1984), brother of Harold **GOSLING** DCM (1898-1918) below.

2nd Lt Arthur Harry **LOXLEY** - Inns of Court Officers Training Corps, 4th Bn., North Staffordshire (Prince of Wales's) Regiment, Attd 6th Bn **KOYLI**. Died on 09 April 1917. Age 19 at Vimy Ridge.

Remembered with Honour: Tilloy British Cemetery, Tilloy-Les-Mofflaines, Pas de Calais, France.

Plot III. H. 8. Medals: British Victory

Born 1898 West Horsley, Surrey. Son of Henry Daniel **LOXLEY** (1872-1949) and Frances Lily **COLBORNE** (1887-1964). They lived in Church House, Finches Lane and were then resident in Carbrook Curridge, Newbury in 1921. At the time of his death in 1949, Henry was a chicken farmer in Twyford, Hampshire.

The north east window in St Nicholas is dedicated to Arthur by his parents.

Pte Charles **FARMER**- 18000, 5th Bn., Dorsetshire Regiment who died on 01 October 1918. Age 26.

Remembered with Honour: Sucrerie Cemetery, Epinoy, Pas de Calais, France. Plot D. 8. A carter on the road. Born 1892 in Baydon, Wiltshire to Charles **FARMER** (1851-) and Rachel (1851-)

BAYDON MEN WHO FELL IN THE 1914-18 WAR CONTD.

Pte Harold Austin **GOSLING** - 36046, Joined the Royal Flying Corps in 16 May 1916 and compulsory transferred in 03 June 1917 to 12th Bn., East Surrey Regiment. He died of a shot wound to his skull on 03 October 1918. Age 20.

Remembered with Honour: Haringhe (Bandaghem) Military Cemetery, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium. Plot III. B. 65. Medals: British War Medal, Victory Medal. Born on 2 Apr 1898 in Highworth, Wiltshire to Jacob GOSLING (1830-1915) and Alice AUSTIN (1870-1918) of The Croft, Finches Lane, Baydon.

Brother of Pte William Jacob GOSLING DCM (1896-1984) who is buried in Baydon Churchyard. (see appendix)

Pte George **READ** -

Reportedly omitted from the brass plaque because he was neither an Anglican nor a Methodist

Mike Ball, Denys Cook, Kev Barnes

Abbreviations : Attd - attached, Bn - battalion, CWGC - Commonwealth War Graves Commission, DCM - Distinguished Conduct Medal, Gnr - Gunner, GWR - Great Western Railway, KOYLI - King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry, Lt -Lieutenant, NKG - no known grave, Pte - Private, Regt - regiment, Sgt - Sergeant , Sqdn - squadron

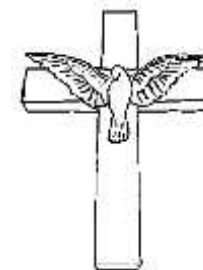

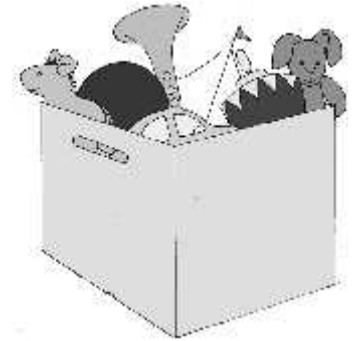

Review of "Benny and Shrimp" by Katarina Mazetti

This book was recommended to me for being funny and it is, in the early chapters, before turning more philosophical. Sorry if this sounds big-headed, but I first read it in French, dictionary on knee, and still found it funny, even comic at times, despite having look up a few words on every page. It isn't something I'd have picked up myself, I think – the title in French means "The bloke from the grave next door", which sounds like a vampire story, and might well attract a different readership than "Benny and Shrimp"!



So. "Shrimp" spends her lunch-hours contemplating the plain headstone of her husband, killed in a road accident just when they'd got used to each other and their plans for a family were beginning to form. Washed-out-looking, supremely orderly, but clearly with a sharp sense of the ridiculous and time passing by, thirty-something Shrimp is taken by surprise by her reaction to a smile from Benny, who comes to plant yet more flowers on a gaudy monument. Benny is equally shocked by his reaction to this child-like woman who seems to make no effort with her appearance and just sits there staring at the headstone and jotting odd lines in a notebook. They embark on a passionate love affair – and a culture clash. I enjoyed the book, and had high hopes for the ending – until the end itself. I found that rather disappointing – sorry! But I won't spoil it for you, just in case.
