

This bit always feels like there is an endless list of jobs to be done, but actually we should look at it from the other end....there is an endless list of jobs that have BEEN done and the building is still standing, looking beautiful and a peaceful place to be after 900 years. That is pretty incredible and we have many generations to thank as well as thanking Baydon's community now. Thank you all.

We have just had a Quinquennial report (done every 5 years by an architect) and the roof repairs have been successful which is wonderful too, thank you again to all who donated time and money to make this possible. A new list of repairs has appeared though so we still need your support.

From the Minister...

By the time you read this, every letterbox in the village should have played host to a card introducing our new "Community Contacts".

In times gone by, people knew everyone in

their street (or even in their whole village) and probably knew quite a lot about their business too! Whether you think that was a good thing or not, it did mean that newcomers were spotted and made to feel part of the community, and, if anyone had a problem, people would know about it quite quickly. Times have changed and it is much easier now for people to come and go, or to live with problems, without anyone else noticing.

In the spirit of "good neighbourliness" the church in the village has set up a system to make sure that at the very least people are made to feel welcome when they first arrive, and that someone is aware if they need support. In many cases, this is simply formalising what already happens in a friendly village such as this – but it also makes the important point that St Nicholas church exists to serve the community in whatever way it can.

So each "Community Contact" will keep an eye on about a dozen houses in the area where they live. They will welcome newcomers with a "Welcome Pack", look out for anyone in need of help or support and act as a communication channel between church and village.

In this way, we hope that the already strong links within the village will be reinforced, as the church tries to live out its task of caring for the world in God's name.

A trip down memory Lane with Clifford Coles

The Scene has always from time to time delved into the history of the village. I tho it would be good to chat about how the village used to be with one of its oldest residents, Clifford Coles.

Cliff moved to Baydon when he married village resident Diana Hunt of Westfields F: 62 years ago. Cliff met Diana 5 years earlier at a dance in Aldbourne Memorial Hall. Cliff and Di were married in Baydon Church and had their reception in the village sch squeezing 80 people into what was then a 2 room building. After renting in the villa for a short-time, they moved into Tubbs Farm House, where Cliff still lives. Di sa passed away 9 years ago.

Cliff and I discussed what amenities there used to be in the village. At one time the were 3 shops. On the main road by the school there was a children's sweet shop (last cottage before the road to Russley Park), on The Aldbourne Road was the Post OI (now a house called Choules Acre) and a shop were the current Baydon Stores are. On the Adbourne road there was a butchers. This is now a house called Pine Cottag

have since spoken with the current owners of Pine Cottag - the Howell family - who tell me they still have artefacts in the house frc the butchers shop).

Baydon was served by 2 pubs at one time The second pub being the Plough, a building which is now a house on Ermin Street.

Next door to the Plough was a Methodist chapel (now also a house). This was one of 2 Methodist Chapels in Baydon. The other was on the Aldbourne Road and was built by the Barnes' of Aldbourne (as in Barnes Coaches). This is also now a house.



There was a Blacksmiths in Baydon, now a house on Ermin Street called the Forge.

Cliff remembers before Ermin Close was built (built in the early 1960's). Part of the land that is now Ermin Close was once a Poultry farm. A large patch of land that is now part of Downsmead, once belonged to the Red Lion.

I asked Cliff about what he remembered being next to Choules Acre – now two houses – as I had heard there was a Church there, or certainly graves. He remembers it being a hall called the Woollen Room, although by the time he moved to Baydon the hall Social gatherings was a nissan hut erected after the War on the site of the cur BYPA.



Traffic Calming update

During the Parish Council Meeting on Mon 12 September, the Independent Saf report and Wiltshire Highways engineer's response regarding the proposed traffic calming buildouts were discussed.

Councillors agreed to go ahead as planned with the buildout on Ermin Street, near to the Ermin Close junct

Regarding the buildout proposed for the western end of Ermin Street, (near the flashing 30mph & school signs), Cllrs agreed to go back to the Community Area Transport Group (CATG) and ask them to restate why the 30mph limit can't be moved further out of the village towards the cricket field. Cllrs also agreed to ask whether the buildout

My name is Luke Prout, i just wanted to share a little information on Community First Respon

Community First Responding is a voluntary role assisting the Ambulance Service, attending emergency situations in our local area. Equipp with thorough training and all the first aid kit you could dream of, we get to the patient before t ambulance, giving vital care where time really ca mean everything.

Whilst we have an absolutely fantastic ambulant service, due to us living a little while out of toour response times are longer than others. This where first responders can really make all the difference.



And don't worry, whilst the training is a lot to take in initially, the actual work volunteer in our area is not that demanding.

After your training, you receive uniform, a full emergency first aid supply and assigned your own call sign on our pager, which you use to sign on with the ambulance control office. After that all you do is keep it within hearing distan -case you are messaged with details of someone in need.

Luckily, being a small village it's really not that busy. But what's really important is that we have a responder on call as often as possible, just so that when the time com when one of us is really needed, we are ready to go.

We are currently looking for people to become Community First Responders in Baydon and the surrounding area. Whether you are an aspiring nurse or paramedic, or simply just want to do your part for your community, first responding is an exciting invaluable opportunity.







Seasonal Flu season again!

If you are aged 65 and over you are automatically entitled to a free flu vaccination. If you fall within any of the 'at risk' groups, Diabetes, COPD, Chronic Heart Disease, Stroke, Immunocompromised and pregnant women you are also entitled to a free flu vaccine. Don't forget unpaid Carers are eligible to a free flu vaccination. If you are a registered patient at Ramsbury & Wanborough Surgery and fit into the above criteria, book your free flu vaccine. Appointments available from late September.

Childhood nasal flu immunisations will start later in October. All children Age 2, 3 or 4 on 1st September 2016 will be eligible to receive this via their GP Surgery. Clinics will be run on Saturday mornings starting late October. In Wiltshire, School Years 1, 2 and 3 will receive this via their Primary School.


